Dear Heidi:

I wanted to write to you to express my concern with the area indicated on your map adjacent to the west side of the Buffalo River. It has been marked in green on the map that I am looking at and green is indicated as an area of exclusion for practically everything.

The map that I have is fairly small and has, what appears to be, a green felt tip marker line drawn along the west side of the Buffalo River with a larger spot close to Great Slave Lake. I have attached a map in this file that shows the area of my concern.

The map really does not indicate exactly the width of the "green line", which obviously starts at the Buffalo River and extends to the west. In conversation with you it was indicated to me that the zone would be 2 km. wide and this would not be acceptable to us as it eliminates potential ore zones and the ability to cross the river. The ability to cross the river would be especially necessary should we have a processing facility or tailings facility on the east side of the river as the current road bridge could not be used.

The claims directly affected are marked on the map as M19, M20 and part of M18 with claim tags F73141, F73142 and F73140 respectively however this does not include the total area of my concern, which is shown as a green box on the attached map.
